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The Iranian nuclear program was originally started in the 1950s with the help of the United States. After the **Islamic Revolution** in 1979, the government temporarily disbanded the programme. Iran soon resumed the programme, albeit with less Western assistance than the pre-revolution era. Iran's current nuclear programme consists of several research sites, a uranium mine, a nuclear reactor, and uranium processing facilities that include a uranium enrichment plant. The Iranian government asserts that the programme's only goal is to develop the capacity for peaceful nuclear power generation, and plans to generate 6000 MW of electricity with nuclear power plants by 2010 but some nations believe it covers an attempt to acquire nuclear weapons. As of 2006 nuclear power does not contribute to the Iranian energy grid.

The Uranium Conversion Facility at Isfahan converts yellowcake into uranium hexafluoride. As of late October 2004, the site is 70% operational with 21 of 24 workshops completed. There is also a Zirconium Production Plant (ZPP) located nearby that produces the necessary ingredients and alloys for nuclear reactors.

According to Reuters, claims by the US that topsoil has been removed and the site had been sanitized could not be verified by IAEA investigators who visited Lavizan:

Washington accused Iran of removing a substantial amount of topsoil and rubble from the site and replacing it with a new layer of soil, in what U.S. officials said might have been an attempt to cover clandestine nuclear activity at Lavizan. Former U.S. ambassador to the IAEA, Kenneth Brill, accused Iran in June of using "the wrecking ball and bulldozer" to sanitize Lavizan prior to the arrival of U.N. inspectors. But another diplomat close to the IAEA told Reuters that on-site inspections of Lavizan produced no proof

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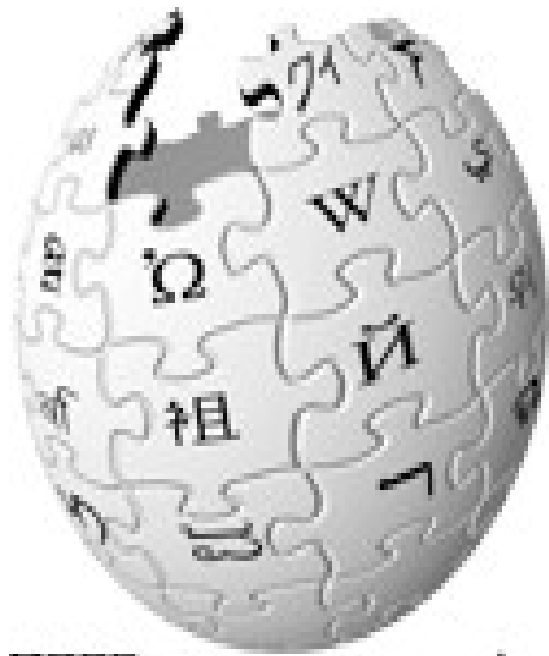
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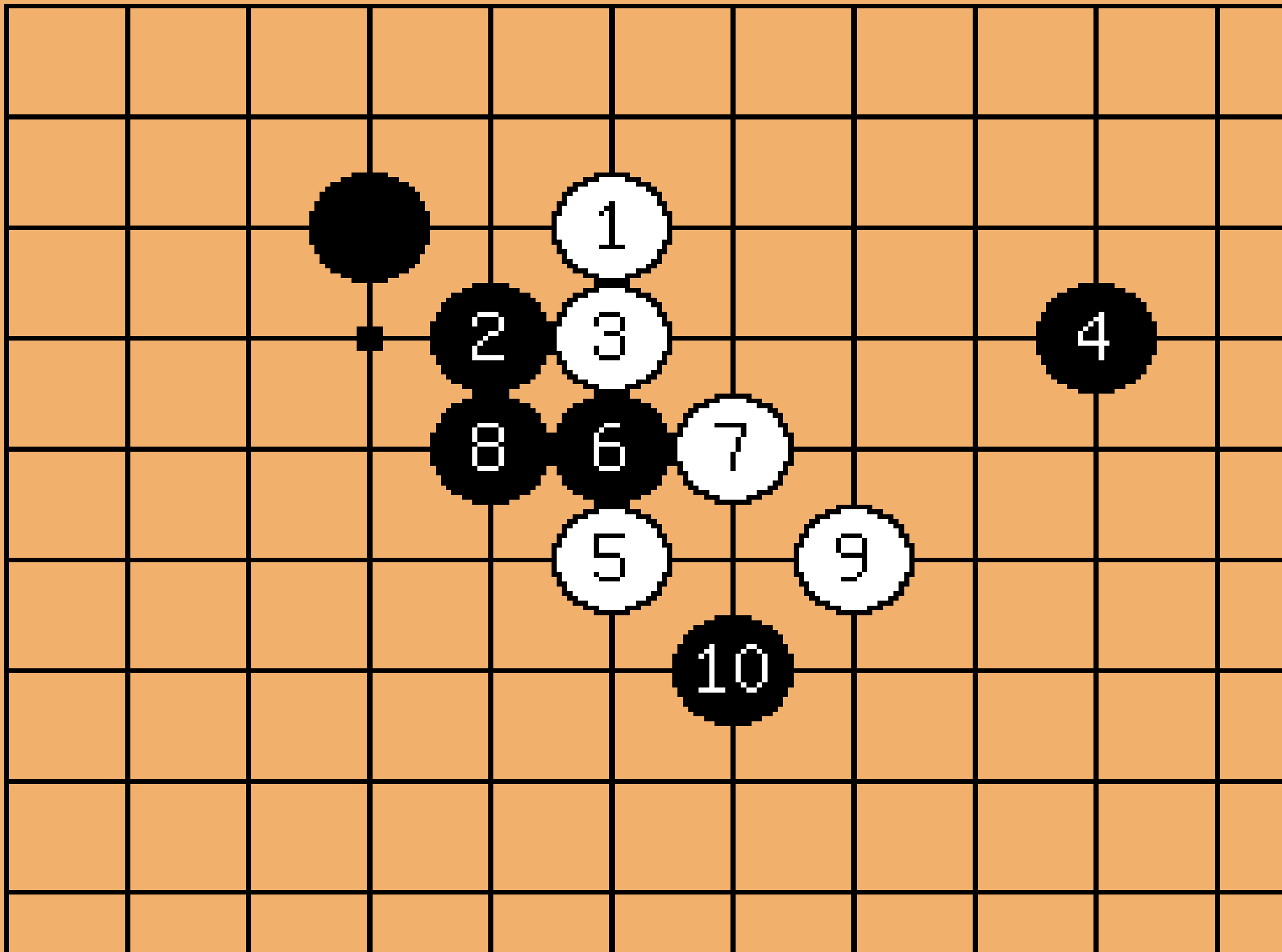
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7 July 2005 London bombings

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The **7 July 2005 London bombings** were a series of coordinated terrorist bomb blasts that hit [London's public transport system](#) during the morning [rush hour](#). At 8:50 a.m., three [bombs](#) exploded within fifty seconds of each other on three [London Underground](#) trains. A fourth bomb exploded on a [bus](#) nearly an hour later at 9:47 a.m. in [Tavistock Square](#). The bombings killed 52 commuters and the four suicide bombers, [injured 700](#), and caused a severe day-long disruption of the city's transport and mobile [telecommunications](#) infrastructure.

On [July 7, 2005](#), explosions or other incidents were reported at various [London Underground](#) stations in central [London](#), specifically [Aldgate](#), [Edgware Road](#), [Kings Cross St Pancras](#), [Old Street](#) and [Russell Square tube station](#). They have been attributed to [power surges](#).

The stations do not share the same line. The incidents led to the immediate evacuation of many stations and apparently now the entire London Underground network and much of the [City of London](#).

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On [July 7, 2005](#), explosions were reported at various [London Underground](#) stations in central [London](#), specifically [Aldgate](#) (at 08:49 local time, in London's [rush hour](#)), [Edgware Road](#), [King's Cross St Pancras](#), [Old Street](#) and [Russell Square tube station](#).

An explosion on a tourist bus between [Tavistock Square](#) and [Russell Square](#) area has been confirmed. They were initially attributed to [power surges](#), but rumours have indicated the possible existence of "at least one explosive device". At least 90 casualties have been reported, but no dead have been officially confirmed, although reports of severed limbs and bodies exist. Hospitals have been placed on alert, with casualties being taken to [St Mary's Hospital](#), [Paddington](#). Reports of explosions on two other buses at [Aldgate East](#) and [Edgware Road](#) have now been confirmed.

There have also been reports of an explosion on [Houndsditch](#) in the [City of London](#), near [Liverpool Street station](#).

The stations do not share the same line (Russell Square and King's Cross are adjacent on the [Piccadilly Line](#), Old Street is on the [Northern Line](#), and the others, as well as King's Cross are all on the [Circle Line](#)). The [National Grid](#) has said it has detected no problems with the power network.

[CNN](#) speculated that the co-ordinated nature of the explosions seemed to suggest a group such as [Al Qaeda](#), a group opposing the [31st G8 summit](#).

The incidents led to the immediate evacuation of many stations and much of the [City of London](#), as well as the complete shut-down of the London Underground network. Roads near the affected stations were closed off, severely affecting road traffic. Mainline services into London stations [Euston](#), [Paddington](#) and King's Cross are terminating outside the city.
